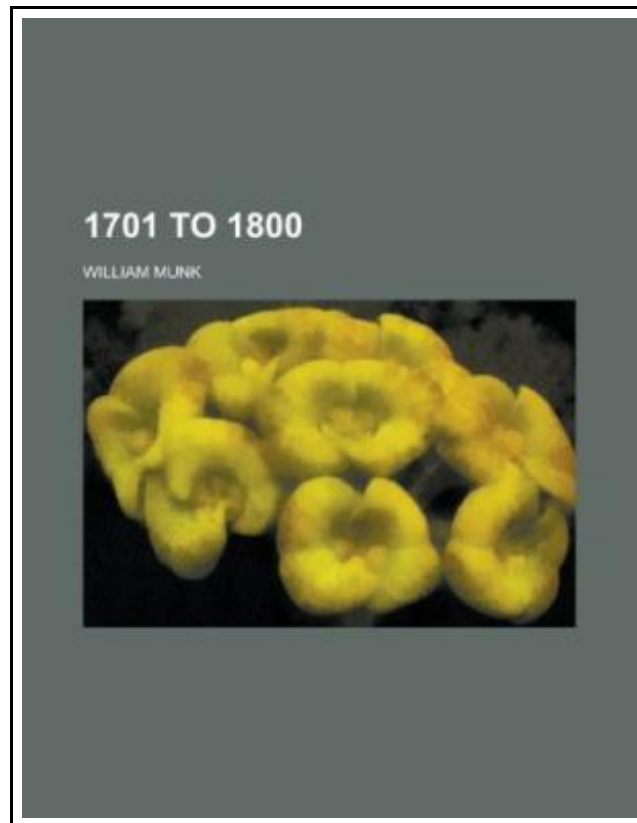

These talents, indeed, cannot be subjected to the scrutiny of literary...
